SEASONAL WORSHIP

The time after Pentecost, the long green season of summer, continues in August. In the gospel of Luke, we find Jesus telling his disciples a parable about the rich fool, reminding us to be rich toward God, who is our treasure. Jesus will also teach us not to fear, "do not be afraid little flock," he calms us. Then Jesus stirs up the crowd when he promises to bring fire on the earth, pitting family member against family member.

When Jesus heals on the Sabbath, the crippled woman immediately responds with praise and thanksgiving, but the leaders of the synagogue become indignant. They wonder why Jesus does not know better! But Jesus' response has the crowds cheering, "rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing!"

Come and join us for worship as we explore these parables and stories of Jesus life and ministry and how, even in our time, we can find relevance in scripture for us today.
