Pastor's Message

Listening to the stories of God's love.



This is what the great Three Days are all about. Maundy Thursday we hear of Jesus lovingly kneeling at his disciples feet to wash them. This humble act of service from their rabbi is a reflection of the love Jesus had for those who would bear witness to his death and resurrection. He taught them what he lived…love one another as I have loved you. Then he was betrayed by one of his own while he went to the garden to pray, asking his father to "let this

cup pass." And in one of the humblest acts of his life, he declared, "not my will, but yours be done."

He was led away and placed on trial. An all night inquisition about his recent behavior, egged on by the religious leaders of his own faith. Under Roman oppression, he was sentenced to death. Within twelve hours he was marched to Golgotha, the place where numerous criminals and innocents were led to face their deaths. After being beaten and taunted, Jesus hung in humiliation on a cross.

The Lamb of God was put to death in order that we might live. On the weekend of Passover, the festival celebrating the liberation of the slaves of Israel, Jesus became our sacrificial lamb. What wondrous love is this?, we sing. Jesus dying a cruel death to save us.

Early on Sunday morning some of the women who were followers of Jesus went to his tomb to care for his body. Concerned about rolling the stone away from the entrance, they were astonished when they discovered it was already accomplished. And Jesus was not inside. He is not here, they were told, he has arisen.

Each of these stories tells the love of God. A God of love who sent his only Son into the world in order that those who believe might have eternal life. As believers of the good news, we gather together during Holy Week to hear these stories once again. To remind ourselves of the love of God. I invite you to come to discover a part of the story you had forgotten or have never heard. Come to celebrate the resurrection of the one who loves you, who died to save you and all of creation!

conversation with friends. If you feel comfortable after receiving your covid vaccines and want to gather for a time of fellowship with others, join Pastor Kristine in the Fireside


Room. We will wear masks and safely distance ourselves, yet enjoy some "together" time.

The Council of First Lutheran Church met **Tuesday**, **March 6**, **2021**. The highlights of the meeting were as follows:

Following the conclusion of the Annual Council retreat, a short Council meeting was called to order by President Alison Hertenstein to act on a couple of current concerns. All Congregation Council members were present for the Council retreat with the exception of Lee Knop. This meeting was called to order at 11:40 AM.

Following discussion, a motion was made by Julie Thiele, seconded by Lori McClaren to discontinue the necessity of RSVP's for the upcoming worship services. The RSVP process will be ended following the Worship of March 7, 2021. Masking will be required and people will be allowed to sit where they are comfortable. Social distancing will continue to be practiced. Motion carried. Prior to the March 7th Worship service, tape will be placed over the ends of alternating pews to encourage safe spacing.

The second item of business concerned the lifting of our current maximum attendance at Worship. Our limit currently stands at sixty persons. Motion Julie Thiele, second by Jenny Denne to set the maximum attendance for any event in the sanctuary at 250 persons. This limit will provide guidance for attendance at any event, including weddings, funerals, or special events. Motion carried.

It was decided to "table" any discussion of the boiler situation for a later meeting due to the hour of the day.

Motion Candy Noonan-Johnson and second by Lori McClaren to adjourn at 12:10 PM. Motion carried.

2020 Sioux City CROP Walk Named a "Cream of the CROP" Walk

The Sioux City CROP Walk has ranked in the top 100 walks in the nation, making it a "Cream of the CROP Walk" for the second year in a row.

In 2020, the 44th Sioux City CROP Walk ranked #3 out of the 28 CROP event held in Iowa last year and #79 out of the 487 events held across the country. "The 2020 Virtual Sioux City CROP Walk had a different look and feel but that didn't stop our community from helping fight hunger," says Shelley Hexom, Sioux City CROP Walk committee member.

Due to the pandemic, the 2020 walk was virtual which meant participants could walk anytime they chose between October 4th-18th. 434 participants laced up their shoes to walk and help fight hunger. Together walkers from 23 different churches, schools and community groups raised \$19,617 and collected 1,320 pounds of food. A Drive Down Hunger Car Parade was held on October 18th as a fun and safe way to deliver the food donations to the Community Action Agency of Siouxland (CAAS). The donated food and 25 percent of the money raised was given to the CAAS to help fight hunger locally. The remainder of the funds raised was used to help fight hunger around the world.

The CROP Walk is Sioux City's only annual inter-denominational event that raises money to help people both locally and in other countries. Walkers can raise money through in-person donations or online by registering at www.crophungerwalk.org/siouxcityia

Sioux City's CROP walk is the second oldest consecutive CROP Walk in Iowa. Together, CROP Walks around the United States raise millions of dollars for Church World Service's worldwide work to alleviate hunger.
