Pastor's Message

Blessing: Be and Do

During Epiphany the appointed gospel readings find Jesus teaching his disciples and the crowds about blessing. The Sermon on the Mount in Matthew's gospel is a long discourse on what we as children of God are blessed to *be and do*.

What Jesus calls blessed is not what we might want be to blessed with! Blessed are those who mourn, who are meek, who are merciful. Being blessed sends us out from worship blessed by God, into the neighborhood, into our families, into our places of work, into the world. We are blessed to be a blessing.

This Lenten season, during our midweek Wednesday services, beginning March 4th, we will explore what it means to be blessed in our vocations. That is in daily life. We have invited members of the congregation to share with us how what they do, their vocation, has been shaped by their faith. In what ways have they been blessed with gifts for service. Gifts which have propelled them to choose a vocation of service to others.

Each of us is blessed to be a blessing. In our baptism we are raised to new life in Christ. We are exhorted to let our light so shine before others, that they may see our good works and give glory to God. Letting our light shine is not about what we do, it is about what we do which gives glory to our Father in heaven.

This Lenten season is full of imagery about baptism. Together we will journey through the waters of our baptism along with Jesus in the desert, Nicodemus in the garden, the Samaritan woman at the well, the blind man in the courtyard and Lazarus in the tomb. Our baptism calls us out of the waters and sends us into the world to serve.

On **Good Friday, April 10 at 7pm**, we gather in silence, remembering Jesus' death on a cross. We will have an opportunity for quiet meditation, to reflect on what Christ's death means for us.

On Easter Sunday morning, April 12 at 7:30 am and 10 am, we will celebrate Christ risen from the dead. Holy Week is a time set aside to remember, reflect, and recognize the abundant mercy and grace of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ.
