The congregation council is delighted to announce we have found a wonderful candidate to fill our Director of Music Ministry opening. Mallorie Egbers has accepted our offer to serve in this 20 hour a week position. She brings a wealth of education, knowledge and experience. She is a native of Iowa and a graduate of Augustana College in Sioux Falls with a Bachelor of Arts in music education. She has a Master of Divinity degree from Sioux Falls Seminary (Luther House of Study) also in Sioux Falls. Mallorie is an organist, piano teacher, educator and choir director.

Mallorie is married to Pastor Scott Egbers, who has accepted a call to serve at Trinity Lutheran, here in Sioux City. They have two children, Elizabeth and Jonathan. They will be moving from Beardstown, Illinois, where they have recently served as organist and pastor, respectively.

Mallorie will begin her work with us in mid-February. Her primary responsibilities will include serving as our organist, directing the adult choir and developing music programs for all ages, with a variety of opportunities for us to sing and ring, praise and worship God. She has shared with me one of the primary reasons she was interested in our position was to create a ministry program for the congregation in which music is the pri-We look forward to mary focus. warmly welcoming her, and her family, to our faith community.

With a new beginning, we recognize there are also endings. We have been thankful and privileged to have Terry Brooks serve as our pianist for the past two and half years. Terry has brought his musical gifts to our worship life especially in the areas of toe tapping and jazz inspiring! Terry came to us when we were in need and he has served us faithfully, weekly showing up to play and participate in our worship life, and to do whatever I would ask him to do! We also thank Carole Heider and Enola Peters who have served as our choir directors for the past eighteen months. As we develop a music program for First Lutheran, there will be places for all of us, including Terry, to participate, to sing praise to God, to ring a handbell or a chime, to learn new songs and sing familiar hymns.

#### SEASONAL WORSHIP

Preparing for the Time after Epiphany

Epiphany is the season of light and our scripture texts and worship services will warm and reflect the light of Christ in the dark, cold days of winter.

In our worship life together, the new year begins with the coming of the Magi, the wisemen, who seek the newborn king. The magi were far from home, out of place. Along their way they would have traveled through strange places, meeting interesting people. Epiphany is a time for us to be aware and mindful of strangers to our community, those who are seeking something but do not know what.

Perhaps in this time after Epiphany there are some simple lessons to be learned. First, be mindful toward and caring of those who serve you as you go about your day. Do not take your waiter, grocery or gas assistant for granted. They are real people.

Second, when you travel you are both a guest and one bearing gifts. You bring something to give – new knowledge, a gentle smile, a different perspective.

Third, the strangers in our midst often understand us better than we understand ourselves. The great gift of the stranger is the opportunity to come to know them and to learn about ourselves in our encounter.

Worship during the time after Epiphany emphasizes the life of the baptized. On January 12 we observe the Baptism of our Lord. Baptism is a call, and based on John the Baptist's witness to Jesus, he initiates a chain of testimony as his disciples begin to share with others what they have found. We have an opportunity during this season to welcome the stranger and follow the Christ. Join us for worship!

## **Notes from Cindy, Our Faith Formation Director**





Epiphany
The revealing of God in his Son to the Nations of the World

Among the earliest Christians in the Eastern Church, Epiphany, January 6, was the important festival day celebrated around Jesus' birth. Epiphany marked the showing off of the baby Jesus to the magi, foreign visitors, who represent all of us from other nations who worship Jesus. In the Western Church, December 25 was chosen as the birthday date for Jesus as an alternative for the secular holiday declared by the Roman emperor for that day. This Christian festival day—Christmas—gradually became more important than Epiphany. Epiphany was known in the earliest Christian centuries as the "Feast of the Manifestation," or the "Feast of Light."

Epiphany has been observed in the Eastern Church from the second or third century A.D. It celebrated the fact that God became man more than the date of Jesus' birth. But eventually the Western Church's observance of Christmas overshadowed Epiphany, which was considered second only to Easter in importance by the Eastern Church.

Epiphany celebrates the discovery that someone has come, sent by God, to bring righteousness into our world and to reveal the amazing depth of God's love.

Images and words for Epiphany include the Magi, the star, light and gold, frankincense and myrrh. Water and wine are also Epiphany symbols to recognize Jesus' baptism and the wedding of Cana, where he performed his first miracle. White is the color of the actual Day of Epiphany, with green following for the remainder of the Epiphany season.

During the darkest, coldest days of winter, we see the light of Christ shining through the darkness.
